Your tour commences with a drive Accommodation: Distinction Hotel Rotorua - 2 nights through the picturesque 1,250 acre sheep farm with spectacular views across to the Kaimai Ranges. Your guide will Day 2 escort you through the ten-acre site recounting fascinating ROTORUA SIGHTSEEING you will see how this beautiful piece of Waikato farmland was New Zealand's premier exports and see the working sheep

transformed into The Shire from Middle-earth. Following our (D) visit to Hobbiton we continue for *lunch at the Otorohanga* Departing from Tauranga we travel over the Kaimai Ranges Lyceum Club, after departing lunch arrive at the famous Waitomo Caves. Here a guide will take you underground to view the amazing limestone caves featuring stalagmites and with a visit to the Hobbiton Movie Set, the bucolic setting for stalactites, which have taken centuries to form. Continue to walk down to an underground stream to board a small boat to view the glow-worm grotto - an underground cavern featuring millions of glow-worms. From Waitomo we travel to Te Kuiti to be hosted by the local Lyceum Club at their Clubrooms for afternoon tea. From the King Country we tour to our next destination - the thermal wonderland of Rotorua, the Sulphur City. Rotorua has the most energetic thermal activity in the country with bubbling mud pools, gushing geysers, beautiful coloured hot springs and terrace formations created by mineral water. Rotorua also has a large Māori population whose cultural activities are interesting and accessible as will be witnessed tomorrow evening.

The Hobbit Enjoy a sightseeing tour of this popular tourist town set on the holes, Green Dragon Inn, Mill and other structures created for shores of Lake Rotorua. Highlights include a visit to the The Lord of the Rings and The Hobbit films can be viewed and Agrodome to learn about how sheep and wool are one of dogs at the entertaining Sheep Show. Continue onwards for your introduction to "The Kiwi" New Zealand's national icon, it is an endangered species and The National Kiwi Hatchery Aotearoa is a world leader in kiwi husbandry, egg incubation systems, hatching techniques and kiwi chick rearing. During your 45-minute guided visit, learn all about the Kiwi bird at the world's most successful kiwi hatchery and discover how more than 2100 kiwi chicks have been hatched here. Gain an understanding of what it takes to hatch a chick and see genuine 'Conservation in Action' in the purpose built incubation facility and if you're very lucky, perhaps see a newly hatched kiwi chick!

This evening visit to *Te Puia for a guided tour followed by the* Te Po (the night) experience - an immersive feast of indigenous cultural storytelling, entertainment food. Your guided tour provides a premier Māori culture experience combined with an introduction to the magnificent geothermal activity in the Whakarewarewa Thermal Valley. Whilst in the valley see the boiling mud pools, steaming silica terraces, hot springs and geysers including the famous Pohutu Geyser which can erupt up to 30-metres high, depending on its mood. Visit the New Zealand Māori Arts and Crafts Institute where young Māori are learning the traditional carving and weaving skills of their ancestors. Your evening experience will commence with a sumptuous buffet dinner including food from the hangi (traditional Māori method of cooking) served in the Pātaka Kai Restaurant. After dinner enjoy a cultural performance in the fully carved Te Aronui-a-Rua meeting house where highlights include waiata (song), mōteatea (traditional chant) poi and haka. Following the concert, the evening culminates with hot chocolate and steamed pudding served in the geothermal valley bathed in coloured light.

Day 3 Wednesday 09th April 2025 ROTORUA – TAURANGA

After breakfast today we take a drive out to see some of the many Rotorua Lakes including the Blue and Green Lakes and Lake Tarawera. Here we visit the historic site of Buried Village to see remains of the Māori village of Te Wairoa that was devastated by the volcanic eruption of Mt Tarawera during the night of June 10, 1886. The excavated village offers a first-hand insight into the chaos and destruction that ensued following the eruption of Mt Tarawera. This eruption also destroyed the famed Pink and White Terraces. From Lake Tarawera we depart Rotorua and travel through to Tauranga via Te Puke — an area which is famous for being the birthplace of Kiwi-Fruit in 1959. Your journey takes us to Mount Maunganui then onto Tauranga. Dinner this evening is at your leisure.

Luggage Allowance

Luggage is restricted to one suitcase and one small item of hand luggage per person. Baggage handling of one suitcase per person, at each hotel, is included in the trip price. Due to limited storage capacity in the motorcoaches used on tour, each case should have dimensions not exceeding 30" x 18" x 10" (76x46x25cm) and 62 linear inches (157cm) and weight not exceeding 50lbs (23kg).
